WARNING NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC

RECALL OF SEVERAL BRANDS OF INFANT MILK DUE TO PRESENCE OF CERREULIDE

A. RECALL OF NUTRICIA APTAMIL AND NUTRICIA APTAJUNIOR

1. The COMESA Competition and Consumer Commission (the “**Commission**”) has been made aware of a recall issued by Nutricia Southern Africa concerning Nutricia Aptamil Nutribiotik 2 (800g) and Nutricia Aptajunior Nutribiotik 3 (800g) products, affecting a total of 2,989 units.
2. According to a media statement released on 6 March 2026 by the National Consumer Commission of South Africa (the “NCC”), a raw material used in the production of the affected batches may contain traces of cereulide, a toxin which, at elevated levels of exposure, can lead to symptoms such as nausea, vomiting, and abdominal cramps.
3. The reported affected batches from Nutricia Southern Africa are as indicated below:

- The NCC reported that the affected products were sold at Dis-Chem and Clicks and distributed in South Africa by United Pharmaceutical since August 2025. B. RECALL OF APTAMIL AND NURSIE INFANT MILK

- The Commission has also become aware of the recall of Aptamil and Nursie Infant Milk following an alert issued by the National Office for Food Safety in Morocco (the “ONSSA”) on 8 March 2026 on its official Facebook page. According to ONSSA, the affected products are likely to contain cerreulide and can cause digestive disorders. ONNSA is reported to have seized the affected products in the market, and these will be destroyed once the recall process is concluded. More information is available on the link below:

- The Commission has established that in the Common Market such products are marketed in Mauritius, Egypt, and Tunisia by Danone, Ubuy, Kim-Fay and Carrefour, among other distributors
- The Commission also noted that in January 2026, Danone recalled several batches of Aptamil and Cow & Gate infant milk products in Europe, which were found to contain cereulide toxin. More information regarding this recall is available on the link below:

The Commission also requests any person who establishes that the above recalled products are available in COMESA to take caution when purchasing or using them and report the matter to the Commission or to their national consumer authority.
